The Clinical Dietician develops nutrition education materials and contributes to other quality initiatives. Most importantly, the Clinical Dietician understands the importance of appreciative inquiry, client-driven health and wellness methods, and collaborates with, supports and empowers clients and families to advocate for their needs to achieve the best health outcomes.

### Key Responsibilities

- Support clients in developing individualized health and nutrition prevention/intervention plans.
- Participates in the continuous improvement of clinical practice guidelines for the centre and participates with the interdisciplinary team in the development of clinical pathways as appropriate.
- Improve nutrition education and access to health and wellness programs and services.
- Develops nutrition education materials and contributes to other quality initiatives.
- Evaluates effectiveness of intervention through patient/client observation, reviewing biochemical parameters with patient and interdisciplinary team, making care plan adjustments as required.
- Build partnerships with community and health service providers.
- Develops clinical indicators for area of practice; maintains statistics and completes documentation for assigned area; provides input into program and departmental strategic planning for area of practice.
